Launch of the Attendance Super League

Attendance at school is incredibly important! At Willington Primary we have a whole range of incentives to actively encourage children to come to school everyday. On our return from the Christmas holidays all children will enter into an Attendance Super League .The league will run in a similar way to a football league. Every week each team will earn points, depending on how good their attendance is. For example 3 points if their weekly attendance is between 99 and 100%, 2 points if between 97.6 and 98.9% and 1 point between 96 and 97.5%. If the teams attendance is below 96% they will receive zero points! The points are accumulated, and at the end of each term, the team with the most number of points will receive an extra special treat! We hope this will become one of the big highlights of each term and will motivate the children to come to school. thus making it easier for you in the mornings! We understand how hard it must be to send your child to school on the occasions when they are reluctant to come!
