



## What 'remote learning' can I expect from Willington Primary School?



- This information is to be used as a general guide and parents can expect further details of remote learning for their child as and when it is required. We aim to implement remote learning from your child's **second day** of absence. Only pupils who are isolating due to Covid need to access this work.
- There are 2 general scenarios outlined below; the first scenario where your child is not permitted to attend school and the second outlines the actions in the case of a whole bubble not being permitted to attend school.

Circumstance	Remote learning
<p>My child (<i>and their siblings if they are also attending Willington Primary</i>) is absent because they are awaiting test results and our household is required to self-isolate. The rest of their school bubble are attending school and being taught as normal.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The main source of communication between the teacher and home learning will be <b>Class DOJO</b>. Weekly activities will be uploaded on <b>Mondays</b>.</li> <li>• <b>Maths lessons</b> will be a link to <i>Oak Academy Online</i> -this will be following on/mirroring the maths being covered in the classroom at that time. The website provides feedback on learning.</li> <li>• <b>English tasks</b> will be focused on developing writing skills. Some/all of these can be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on DOJO for marking or be brought in on your child's return to school</li> <li>• <b>RWI for KS1</b> – sound focus will be given</li> <li>• <b>Spellings</b> – will be posted weekly. Spelling tests can be administered at home and results given to the teacher via DOJO</li> <li>• <b>Topic task(s)</b> Oak Academy online lessons can be used for remote learning for every year group, covering a wide range of curriculum objectives. <a href="https://www.thenational.academy/">https://www.thenational.academy/</a></li> <li>• BBC Bitesize also provide a range of resources to supplement learning: <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize">https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize</a></li> </ul>
<p>My child's whole bubble is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble, have tested positive for Covid-19.</p> <p>We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The main source of communication between the teacher and home learning will be <b>Seesaw</b>. Please ensure that you are able to access your child's Seesaw account and let their teacher know if you are unable to access it.</li> <li>• <b>Teacher video</b> outlining the daily tasks to be completed*</li> <li>• <b>Maths lessons</b> uploaded to Seesaw. This may be a combination of white rose maths videos (the scheme used in school) and resources/worksheets used in the classroom. Answers will be provided for self-marking at home.</li> <li>• <b>English tasks</b> uploaded to Seesaw following the sequence of learning that would have been happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. Some/all of these will be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on Seesaw for marking. This will include spelling, grammar, writing and reading.</li> <li>• <b>Topic task(s)</b> will be uploaded to <b>Seesaw</b> for children to complete and hand in virtually. These will be lessons your child would have had in class this term which can be most easily adapted to remote learning.</li> </ul>
